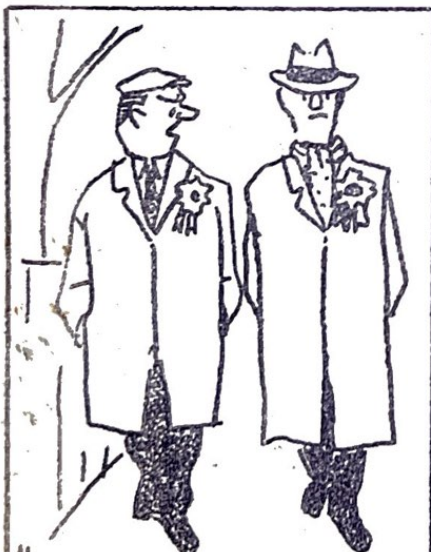


COMPETITIVE GAME ENDS WITH 5-2 VICTORY.

The visitors were challenging with more determination in midfield and although Bennett continued to threaten a goal on the right the Inst. attack faded as half time neared. 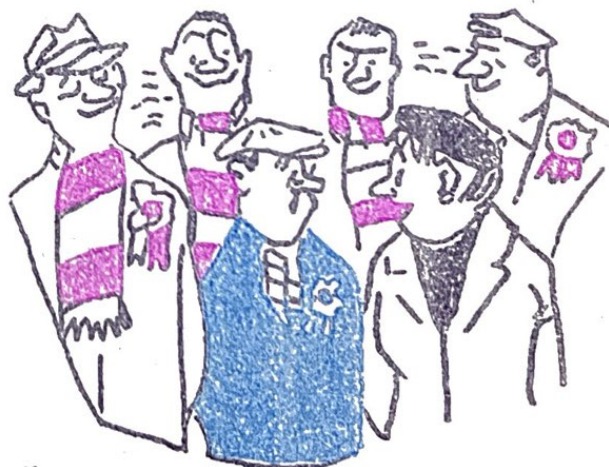

SUPER REDS MARCH ON TO MAGIC TREBLE

Liverpool are still well on course for the achievement of the century the amazing treble. I know many readers will have seen the games against Everton but just for the record here are my impressions of the two games. I suppose most readers are aware that the editor is a 'red' but these comments are not in the least bit biased. Liverpool are the greatest anyway so there is no argument there. The conditions in the first game were far from perfect. A lot of rain just before kick off left the pitch very greasy indeed. I thought that the City groundstaff were very badly prepared, only when the players came onto the pitch was any attempt made to remove the surface water. The reason I mention this is that the conditions robbed David Fairclough of a memorable goal in the very first minute. After a

one occasion when he cleared the ball off the Instituto goal-line. Shortly before half time Limavady equalised after a scramble in the Inst. goalmouth. At this stage it was anyones game and both teams played hard in the first 10 minutes of the second half. It was now that the persitence of Hamilton paid off. He made progress down the left wing and shot from 15 yards. The goalkeep er could not hold the ball and it trickled over the line. Minutes later Institute went into a 3-1 lead when the Limavady defence stood still , appealing for offside, and allowed Regan to take the ball to the bye-line. He pulled the ball back for Diable to score. Halewood replaced Hassell and Freckleton replaced Langford. Shortly after Warburton came on for Diable but with 15 minutes remaining Limavady came back into the game when they scored a fine goal from a header. In the last ten minutes it was Regan who dominated play. He capped this fine ending with two fine goals that gave Institute just a slightly flattering scoreline. Johnson and O'shaughnessy had played well throughout and Halewood showed some very nice touches in midfield . Hamilton and Bennett were dangerous on the flanks. I should like to mention Ventre and Eddie Mcgee who patiently waited on the touchline as subs. Ventre kept a record of events in the first half. All the statistics of the season will be included in the next edition , probably next week.

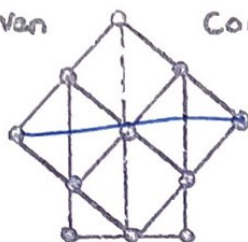
